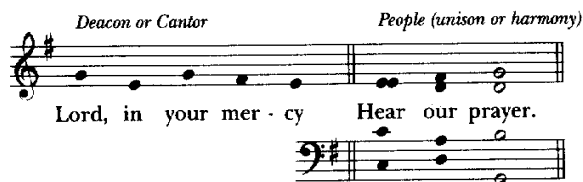
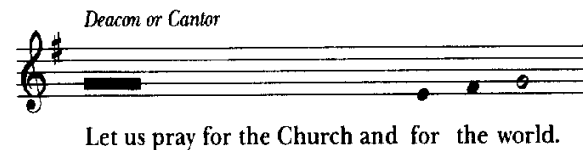

THE NICENE CREED
